Sunday October 6th Cascadia Reed Quintet



Sunday December 8th McGregor - Verdejo Duo

The McGregor - Verdejo Duo is a flute and guitar duo known for its exciting and innovative recitals as well as the performers' effortless musical connection. This duo performs many major classical works for flute and guitar as well as a variety of musical genres. These performers are both masters of their instruments elevating flute and guitar to the highest level of virtuosity and artistry. They regularly perform throughout British Columbia and their live performances are filled with energy and passion.

Sunday March 8th Jumaralis Trio

This trio is a chamber music ensemble made up of one clarinet, one cello and one piano. Similar to the classical piano trio, in this ensemble the violin is replaced by the clarinet. The dramatically contrasting qualities of timbre in these instruments offer many musical possibilities with Beethoven being one of the first composers to make use of the somewhat unusual combination. Many other composers followed suit as upon hearing Brahms' Clarinet Trio op.114, his friend and scholar Eusebius Mandyczewski stated: "It is as though the instruments were in love with each other." Clarinetist Julie Begg is joined by cellist Alison Patterson & planist Martha Brickman to present a concert to be savoured.

Expert in virtually every style of music, A Touch of Brass is in demand all over British Columbia for both recitals and educational clinics.
